




PENITENTIAL ACT



RITE of Ordination to the Priesthood

ELECTION OF THE CANDIDATES

Reverend Andrew Hofer, O.P.

Immediately after the Gospel, the candidates are presented to the Archbishop, who formally chooses them for the Sacred Order of Priests.

Archbishop: Relying on the help of the Lord God and of our Savior Jesus Christ,

we choose these, our brothers, for the Order of the Priesthood.

Congregation: Thanks be to God.

HOMILY


EXAMINATION

At the end of the homily, the Archbishop questions the elect about their resolve to undertake and fulfill faithfully the ministry to which they are about to be ordained and their willingness to unite themselves more closely to Christ, the High Priest.

PROMISE OF OBEDIENCE

The elect kneel before the Archbishop and promise respect and obedience to the diocesan bishop and their religious superiors.





LAYING ON OF HANDS

Veni Creator Spiritus Rabanus Maurus (d. 856) arr. Michael O'Connor, O.P.

In the ancient apostolic gesture of ordination, the Archbishop imposes his hands on the heads of the elect and prays for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Those priests present also impose their hands.

PRAYER OF ORDINATION

In this prayer, the Archbishop beseeches God to raise the ordinandi to the priesthood. He prays that God will make them co-workers with the bishops in the proclamation of the Gospel, and for the sanctification of the people. Through the imposition of hands and the prayer of ordination, the elect are ordained priests.

INVESTITURE WITH STOLE AND CHASUBLE

Come Down, O Love Divine Bianco da Siena (d. 1434)

The newly ordained are invested with the priestly stole and the chasuble. By this investiture, the ministry they will henceforth fulfill in the Liturgy is outwardly manifested.

Anointing of the Hands

Sacerdos in Æternum Psalm 110:4; V. Psalm 116, 118

The Archbishop anoints the hands of the newly ordained with the Sacred Chrism, symbolizing their distinctive participation in Christ's priesthood. During the anointing, the Archbishop prays: "The Lord Jesus Christ, whom the Father anointed with the Holy Spirit and power, guard and preserve you that you may sanctify the Christian people and offer sacrifice to God."

HANDING OVER OF THE BREAD AND WINE

Conform Your Life Philippians 2

The gifts of bread and wine are brought forward to the Archbishop, who hands them over to each new priest, saying: "Receive the oblation of the holy people, to be offered to God. Understand what you do, imitate what you celebrate, and conform your life to the mystery of the Lord's cross."

FRATERNAL KISS

You Are My Friends John 15:14; V. Psalm 100

The ordination rite concludes with the Archbishop giving the newly ordained the fraternal kiss. The newly ordained take their places with the other concelebrating priests.





Guidelines for the Reception of Holy Communion

For Catholics

As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour.

For our fellow non-Catholic Christians

We welcome our fellow Christians to pray with us in this Mass as our brothers and sisters in Christ, but we cannot admit them to Holy Communion. We believe that the celebration and communion of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship; therefore, it would be a falsehood to partake together of the one Eucharist when that unity of faith, life, and worship is absent. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions that separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (John 17:21).

Members of the Orthodox Churches, the Assyrian Church of the East, and the Polish National Catholic Church are urged to respect the discipline of their own Churches. According to Roman Catholic discipline and the Code of Canon Law, the reception of communion by Christians of these Churches is permitted (c. 844).

For those not receiving Holy Communion

All who are not receiving Holy Communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another.

For non-Christians

We also welcome to this celebration those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.


